#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: A movie is always at its best during the point of conflict, when the hero of the movie is facing an existential threat. The sacrifice and bravery of the hero captivates the audience. As soon as the hero attains victory, however, the movie begins to pan away. A few final scenes of peace, joy and resolution and then the credits roll.

I often feel this way during Holy Week. The liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil captivate something deep within me. The prep for these liturgies causes some stress. However, the experience of the liturgies surpasses every anxiety. Just as a movie is most captivating at the point of conflict, a similar thing happens during the liturgies of the Triduum, as these liturgies communicate in a profound sacramental manner the decisive victory of Jesus over sin and death through his suffering and death upon the Cross.

Yet the Triduum is not an end in itself. The suffering and death of Jesus leads to the glory of the Resurrection. Easter Sunday is indeed filled with peace and harmony, yet for me something is always missing on Easter Sunday morning. For me, Easter Sunday always feels a bit like the last few minutes of a movie. Something captivating is lost. Why? Nothing on this earth can replicate the joy God will give us. The sufferings of Christ are relatable because on earth there is suffering. The joys of the Resurrection, however, are so far beyond our comprehension, that nothing in this world can ever compare.

The highest of liturgies on Easter Sunday, therefore, can never replicate what God has prepared for us in heaven. In heaven the sorrows and sufferings of this world will be forgotten in the perfection of the love, peace, joy and fullness of God's presence. The eternal delights of heaven are such that 'no eye has seen, no ear has heard, nor has it entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him.' (1 Cor 2:9)

We are people of the Resurrection. Our hope is in the Resurrection. Rejoice this day, this Easter Sunday. However, be reminded that we are not there yet. We are on pilgrimage. Remain rooted to daily prayer, to daily Mass, to following the commandments. The Cross of Christ saves us. With the Cross we can dare to hope for the gift of God's eternal love in heaven.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.
