FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This Saturday, June 24th, is the Feast of St. John the Baptist, our patronal feast day. On this day we have 4 new men ordained to the priesthood. One of these men, Fr. Jared Clements will be joining us here in Marshfield as the new chaplain at Columbus. As we celebrate these ordinations with joy, we also must pray as June 24th is also the day that our city in Marshfield is hosting its 3rd annual drag show. Yet we have hope, for on June 24th is also the largest gathering of pro-lifers in our state! This will be the Third Annual March for Life Wisconsin as it commemorates the historic Dobbs v. Jackson ruling which overturned Roe v. Wade. Great change is possible, and as mentioned last weekend at Mass I encourage that on June 24th of this year we each make an intentional effort to both fast and pray, for both the support of our new priests, for the support of our families, and for the dignity of all life to be restored.

I recently completed my annual priest retreat. It was a very fruitful time of reflection and prayer. I spent almost a week in a private priest house next to a cloistered convent of Dominican nuns. When I first arrived, I went to the entrance to retrieve my keys. To do this, I spoke with one of the cloistered nuns. In our brief conversation she mentioned that she had been cloistered for 46 years. As she shared this, she handed me my garage door opener saying, "You probably know much more about this than I, but here is the opener for the door to your garage." For forty-six years this wonderful nun has never left the walls of her convent. This is an amazing reality! She has voluntarily given up her freedom, so that she could have greater freedom in Christ.

In living in this remarkable manner, she and the other nuns (one of whom is the sister of Fr. Dan Sedlacek's brother-inlaw) demonstrate the powerful witness of the Gospel. Lasting happiness does not arise from our travels, from our material possessions, or from prestige and fame; but rather that we are beloved by Christ and desire to dwell with Him. In this progressive modern world the vocation of stability found in the cloistered life is a radical proclamation of the richness found in Christ alone. The more time we spend with Jesus, the more time we will experience His blessings and love! As we celebrate the feast of our Beloved Patron, may St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish.
