FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: As I mentioned last week, after Mass today a short 120 page book by Bishop Barron entitled, 'This is My Body' will be made available. Currently we have just 300 copies. However, as we get more, we will also make these available to those who are homebound who also wish to receive a copy. Additionally, an invitation will be extended to sign up for a holy hour in our adoration chapel.

In the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, our Lord makes a startling claim. He says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." As we know from overwhelming evidence, our earthly life will come to an end. Physical death is a reality for all of us. However, our faith in Jesus' words says something deeper. We know that if we die in Jesus Christ, we will have an eternal destiny that will never change. We will be eternally embraced by God's perfect and incredible love. This is truly an awesome and indescribable gift which words can never justly describe.

When we receive the Holy Eucharist with great faith, we begin to experience a foretaste of our eternal destiny in heaven. Therefore, in your life develop a deep love for the Holy Eucharist. Contemplate its presence before Mass. Throughout Mass yearn for the moment you will receive the Lord. When you receive Communion, give great thanksgiving to God for such a blessed gift. As you return back home and go about the daily activities create a deep desire within yourself to receive again the most Holy Eucharist at your next Mass.

Jesus says he is the bread of life. He says that when we receive him, we shall live forever. Jesus has instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper and instructed his apostles (and the priests who followed them) to do this in memory of him. Thus, even in our present age wherever Holy Mass is celebrated we receive the true living bread from heaven. In fostering devotion to the Holy Eucharist by attending Mass every Sunday, even daily if possible, and by visiting our Lord in Adoration, you will experience the powerful gift of Jesus' healing and transformative love. As a priest I can give the greatest gift of the Eucharist; and it is in Jesus in the Eucharist that you will experience salvation and blessing.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

The Eucharist is called the Holy Sacrifice

A sacrifice is the act of giving up something highly valued for the sake of something else, considered to have a greater value or claim out of love for another person and/or for God. The perfect sacrifice was Christ's death on the Cross, by which He offered Himself to the Father out of love for us, which accomplished our salvation. The Holy Mass is a sacrifice because it is the re-presentation and the memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. The sacrifice of Calvary is being made present in an unbloody manner on the altar at



Mass. Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

Jesus, please give me the grace to appreciate the sacrifice that is made present at every Mass in which You offer Yourself to the Father out of love for me.

This week, read Luke's account of Jesus offering Himself in sacrifice to the Father for love of us in Luke 22:14-20.


