#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: I am hoping to recommence a Baptism Class/Mentoring ministry in our parish. This year we have had 32 Baptisms and during the month of July alone we had ten. Thanks be to God for this great blessing in our parish!

Typically for a Baptism, a couple calls the parish office. We take their information. The parents watch a few videos from Formed.org on Baptism, I meet with the parents for a small class, and then the Baptism happens. The turn-around time is generally between 2 weeks and 2 months from the time of the parents' original call to the time of the Baptism.

Many of the children being baptized are from strong faithcentered families. About half, however, do not have much connection to our church. I am hoping that the following program will help connect these families to our parish and the many blessings we have here.

My goal is to schedule about 3 meetings a year as a mini-Baptism retreat/session. The day would include three talks given by married couples in the parish on topics such as Catholic Education/Columbus, Raising children Catholic, and Prayer at Home. A light food option would also likely be provided. The most important part of this retreat will be the mentoring portion, called something such as, "Getting Connected."

Thus, the needs are as follows:

1) Overall Point person to connect baptism family with mentoring family.

2) Younger active couples who in the last several years have had their own children baptized and who could now serve as mentors to new parents - This would involve at least an initial phone call and then perhaps sending a card/gift on an annual basis. It could also involve a meeting in person, praying together, etc. - whatever seems comfortable and natural. I am hoping that this mentoring relationship with the parents could continue until their child is of age to enter Marshfield Family Faith Formation or Columbus. Thus, bridging the gap between Baptism and Catechetical formation.

3) Gift bags, cards, welcoming items – provided by the parish and given by the mentoring couple throughout the years of the mentoring relationship.

4) Couples to give talks at the retreats.

A very similar structure happens for every funeral we have at St. John's. Each family of a deceased person is contacted by a lead or point bereavement minister. This minister provides help in planning the funeral liturgy, provides a condolence gift, and maintains the family contact for All Souls Day. They then continue to journey with the family as is needed. This is a wonderful ministry and I wish to thank so much everyone who is involved in our bereavement ministry for our parish! I am thinking that we can create a similar model for mentoring the parents of the newly baptized.

In particular, this mentoring relationship would be for parents who are not already active in our church. Those parents active in the parish could request a mentoring couple, but it would not be necessary.

Let me know if you would like to be part of this ministry to our families preparing for Baptism. I'd be happy to meet or talk if you have any questions.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish.

#### At Mass, the Scripture Readings prepare us to receive Jesus

There are two major parts to the Mass: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In the Liturgy of the Word, we listen to three Readings and a Psalm from Sacred Scripture (the Bible). These Readings help us recall all that God has done for us: His love and His plan for us. We stand up for the third Reading – the Gospel, the most



important Reading – because Matthew, Mark, Luke and John deliver the message that Jesus brings, and include quotations of HIs very own spoken words. After the Gospel, the priest or deacon help us to understand these Readings from the Bible and how to apply the message to our daily life in order to be a more faithful follower of the Lord. Hearing the Words of Scripture and the Homily which follows helps our hearts to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, help me to come to Mass with an open heart, ready to hear the Readings from Scripture and the Homily in order to know You better.

This week, read from the Letter of Paul to Timothy about the importance of God's Word: "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, correction and training in righteousness, so that the man (or woman) of God may be fully competent and equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

#### Sept. 13 - Rural Life Day - Marshfield - All are Welcome


