The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: I remember the election of Pope Francis in 2013. As I was standing in the middle of the Square of the Basilica of St. Peter, I saw hundreds and thousands of people of every background and of every nation fill St. Peter's square for the monumental announcement of the new Pope. We did not share the same language, but we shared the same love for the Church. The Catholic Church fulfills Matthew 28 in bringing the unity of the Gospel to the diversity of the entire world, from the east to the west. Each of us are made in God's image and likeness. Our uniqueness reflects God's omnipotence. The message of the Gospel is meant for all peoples of every unique background. The Gospel calls all of us into the fullness of life for which God has created us.

As we rejoice in the complexity of God's creation, our readings for this weekend nevertheless urge us to be strong witnesses of the one truth in Christ. St. Paul says, "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." (Romans 12:2)

As Catholics, our morality is best framed by the concept of virtue. Virtue is the habit of doing good. A perfect metaphor for virtue is a sports player. Through repetition and practice an athlete creates the habit of doing well in his/her sport. The same is true in morality. By repeated good actions a person develops a habit of doing good. Likewise, in sport, the game is filled with complexity, yet victory is achieved only through a singular manner. (For instance, a golfer has to deal with a complexity of issues from both weather and terrain, yet victory is only achieved by putting the ball into the hole. He/she cannot alter the rule by which victory is achieved) Thus, morality too works with a complexity of challenges, yet it likewise has just one path to virtue. There is a oneness in moral truths, just as there is oneness to victory in sports. Morality is not relative, it is objective.

How can we discern a moral truth? How do we know a moral truth? We as Catholics have the gift of revelation, both from sacred scripture and sacred tradition. God has given us moral truths, through His revealed Word. We likewise are blessed to have the Magisterium (the Pope and the Bishops), who guided by the holy Spirit articulate the truths of revelation for every age.

As Catholic Christians we celebrate the complexity of God's creation, while firmly holding that morality is objective. To speak the truth on moral issues is an act of love. Truths should be spoken with empathy and compassion, but they must always be spoken. May we be blessed with the gift of fortitude and charity so that we are not conformed to this age but are renewed so as to know what is good and pleasing and perfect.


