FROM THE ASSOICATE PASTOR'S DESK

It has been over two months since my arrival here at St. John the Baptist Parish. It has been an exciting two months in my ministry. Over the last two months, I have seen the generosity of all of you, the parishioners, and the willingness to be actively involved in parish life. One thing that stands out for me is the number of people who attend daily Mass throughout the week. It is inspiring to see a lot of people who attend daily Mass here at St. John's. It is inspiring for me as a priest to offer daily with a large number of people in attendance, something that did not really happen in my previous assignment.

In the last two months also, I have made a lot of visits to the hospital and nursing homes. I find visiting hospitals and nursing homes humbling as I witness people at their most vulnerable. It has been a joy for me being back in Marshfield. I have been able to reconnect with people that I had met previously from when I was a seminarian living at Our Lady of Peace parish.

Being in Marshfield has also allowed me to be close to friends and family. As most of you know, I went to college at UW-Stevens Point and lived in Stevens Point for about six years after graduating from college. I still have some friends who live near Stevens Point. Usually on my day off when I am not visiting my parents and brothers and sister in Elkhorn, Wisconsin, I spend with friends who live just outside of Stevens Point.

I am happy and grateful to God for being part of this community of faith. Thank you for the great hospitality and welcome gestures that you have offered me in the last two months. All of us have a longing for communion and belonging in a community. This reflects God's desire to enter a communion and relationship with us. May all of us continue to grow in communion with God and with the people around us.


EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL The Vital Connection between the Eucharist and Confession
