### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This past Friday I traveled with my parents to see my Godfather. As a result, I felt moved to share a few personal memories about my Godparents. In so doing perhaps you can be encouraged to send a note of thanks to your own Godparents and also to any Godchildren you may have.

I was baptized in 1980 on the Feast of St Lawrence, a connection I only discovered during Seminary when I was submitting my sacramental information. My middle name is Lawrence along with my Dad's name, thus a special connection. My Godparents were an uncle and aunt on my Dad's side. I remember fishing trips with them, visiting an old unique mansion that they restored, and fireworks. I had around fifteen uncles and fifteen aunts, but this uncle and aunt were special as they were my Godparents. Without being able to express it, I knew as a young kid that my Godparents represented God in a special way. The primary way that they communicated God to me was their Faith. I did many special things with my Godparents, but now as an adult I realize that it was not the fishing trips and the outings that spoke to me most, rather it was simply the question - did they believe in God or not. As a couple, my Godparents never had kids but both of them did a lot to help people in difficult situations get housing. They knew how important housing was and they did what they could to help people who were down on their luck. As a kid, this spoke to me; however, what most deeply spoke to me was the witness of their belief in God. Their faith was not perfect, but the fact that they had Faith was so important to me. To me it was simple. They were my Godparents so I just needed them to believe in God.

My Godmother passed away some years ago. She didn't have a funeral in the Church. My Godfather remarried. He has a great humility and is overjoyed that I became a priest. Currently his health and his new wife's health are declining so it's tougher for them to travel. About once a year I try to travel the 5 hours to see them.

I now have three Godchildren of my own. Three boys: ages 12, 8, and 4. I try to be present in their life and I try to communicate to them my belief in God. It's interesting how two of them have all along been talking about becoming priests. A few weeks ago, I mentioned in the bulletin column about a desire to recommence a Baptism ministry in our parish. Let me know if assisting in this has been growing in your heart. With this column I would also like to encourage you to call your Godchildren and be that witness of God in their life; at the same time if your Godparents are still with you, to give them a call of gratitude.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish. Fr. Thelen
