FROM THE ASSOICATE PASTOR'S DESK

Since becoming a priest, I became involved in Hispanic ministry here in the Diocese of La Crosse. assignment was at Holy Family Parish in Arcadia, Wisconsin which has had a stable Hispanic ministry for the past fourteen years or so. Being involved in Hispanic ministry is one of the most challenging and rewarding ministries that I get to work with as a priest. It is a challenge because, everything that I have learned in the church has been in English and from the American cultural point of view.

Over the last two years, I had to learn the specific pastoral challenges that many Hispanics face here in the United States. In addition to this I had to learn the different Catholic traditions that I vaguely remembered from my childhood experience and adopt them to fit the need of the Hispanics living here in the United States. Catholicism tends to be more earthy with a lot more emphasis on devotional life of the church (i.e., novenas, processions, big celebrations of patronal feast days, etc.). Also, a big difference between Hispanic Catholicism and American Catholicism is that Hispanic Catholicism focuses more on emotions and feelings, compared to American Catholicism which focuses more on reason and pragmatism. It is my strong belief that both communities have something good and holy to teach to one another so that all of us can grow deeper in our relationship with God.

Over the last three months, I have celebrated four baptisms in Spanish, and I have been able to meet with a few Hispanic individuals who have been going to Mass in Wausau and Abbotsford and they have told me that it is difficult for them to travel every weekend to get to Mass on a regular basis. After careful consideration and after talking to different members of the parish, Father Thelen and I have decided to start a Spanish Mass the first Sunday of the month at 4:00pm starting in October.

By doing this it is our hope that word can get out in the Hispanic community and to start building up the Hispanic community and eventually making the Spanish Mass part of the regular Mass schedule here at John's. Eventually as the word gets out about the Spanish Mass the church will host different devotional prayer events in Spanish which will be open to all members of the parish.

As if this is not enough, I am also the Director of Emmaus Ministry for the Diocese which is part of the Diocesan Hispanic ministry outreach. This ministry consists of a weekend retreat for men and women based on the Gospel passage from Saint Luke 24:13-35 where the disciples had a transformative journey as they encountered the Lord on the Road to Emmaus. The disciples encounter the risen Lord, and they renew their love and friendship in the risen Lord. The retreat focuses on conversion or reconversion by means of personal testimony and catechesis to foster a personal relationship with the Risen Lord. After the retreats, people who assist the retreat are connected to an Emmaus Parish support group in which they are encouraged to become active members of the parish by helping out as need be on different ministries or activities in the parish.

As the year progresses, I will be hosting here in the parish different events where members of Emmaus Ministry from across the diocese will come for different catechetical sessions and organizing other events for the Emmaus retreats which usually take place in the early summer. As you can see, there will be a lot of new and exciting things coming to St. John's Parish and as we embark in these new adventures, I ask that we keep open hearts and minds to the different ways in which the Holy Spirit is calling us to serve and grow deeper in our relationship with Christ.
