FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: Each year on October 7th the universal church celebrates the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. This memorial was established by Pope Pius V in thanksgiving for the victory at Lepanto in 1571. As a seminarian, I remember travelling to Greece and standing on the shores of this sea with some of my fellow classmates praying a Rosary in thanksgiving for this victory. This sea marked the spot of a great sea battle between Christian Europe and the Muslims of the Ottoman Empire. The Ottoman fleet presented an almost insurmountable force; nevertheless, through a miraculous turn of events the Christian fleet won the battle, protecting and saving Christian Europe from invasion. Historically, this has been seen as a pivotal moment in history.

The Holy Rosary was a powerful spiritual weapon in this victory and continues as an equally powerful force in victory in our own day. Pope Pius V called upon all of Christendom to pray the Rosary in 1571 and petition heaven for victory. With the same urgency we should call upon heaven through the intercession of Our Lady and the praying of the Rosary for our spiritual protection and blessing. Fr. Don Calloway has written a wonderful book on the Holy Rosary entitled: 'Champions of the Rosary', highlighting the historical and the theological importance of the Rosary. My professors in seminary, all Dominicans, wore a Rosary on their left side as part of their habit. Fr. Don Calloway describes this custom as a Spiritual Sword of our Lady, as it was the left side that the medieval knights held their physical swords to defend themselves, so the Dominicans carry a Rosary also on their left side.

I myself know how powerful the Rosary has been in my own life. As a child my family prayed a decade of the Rosary between supper and milking the cows, a full five decades during Lent. At the age of twenty-six I felt a strong movement, even a calling, to again pray the Rosary. I began on that day to pray the Rosary and have prayed a Rosary each day for the last seventeen years. To me the moment of hearing the call to pray the Rosary was a watershed moment. In my twenties I always wanted to find good Catholic friends, but never did. However, from the time that I began to pray the Rosary I have been surrounded by strong Catholic friends ever since. I know in my life that there was a significant difference, a before and after, due to my praying of the Rosary. I therefore strongly encourage you to take up the habit and pray this most powerful prayer, the most Holy Rosary.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish.
