FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This weekend I will be announcing the 2023-2024 Diocesan Annual Appeal for our parish. The diocese is asking our parish to raise \$133,350 for the needs of the diocese. This total is a few thousand dollars less than our target from a few years ago. You will be receiving information in the mail regarding this campaign. The goal of this campaign is to cover the annual administrative costs of the diocese, diocesan support of parishes, and expenses for seminarian formation.

This annual appeal is different than the Inspired by the Spirit campaign, which was conducted last year. The Inspired by the Spirit campaign returned 65% of the monies back to the parish. The remaining 35% was retained by the diocese for physical upgrades to the Holy Cross Diocesan Center and the creation of an endowment for the diocese. The Diocesan Annual Appeal was omitted last year, as it was covered by the funds raised through the Inspired by the Spirit Campaign. However, this pause was only for one year. As in years past, the Diocesan Annual Appeal will recommence this year and continue for the years to come.

The Diocesan Annual Appeal is an important way to contribute to the help of the Church. In particular, it assists with the formation of new priests for our diocese. We are blessed to have one of own young men in the formation process, Luke Kaiser, the son of Brian and Jean Kaiser. Luke is discerning the priesthood for our diocese and is currently in the Journey Program, the first year of discernment. Please pray for him as he discerns his vocation.

We have been blessed with wonderful priests here at St. John's for so many years. Each of these priests received their formation because of the generosity of the diocese and parish support. In looking back at the many pastors and associates that served St. John's in the past 30 years, I think each one came from a different community outside of Marshfield. They experienced their vocation because of the blessings they received from the diocese and the parishes that supported them. We then were blessed to receive their priestly service because of the generosity that came from others.

In this service of generosity please be open to helping support the Diocesan Annual Appeal. If we exceed our goal, 100% of the amount in excess is returned to our parish.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish. Fr. Thelen
