#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: Our parish here at St. John's is deeply blessed. The opportunities to encounter Christ within our parish are three-fold.

First - One-on-one time with Jesus. Within our parish, all 168 hours of every week are dedicated to prayer. Day and night, one or two adorers pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament in the St. John Paul II Chapel. This one-on-one time with Jesus is powerful and fruitful. It provides protection and blessing for our parish our community, our families, and our neighborhoods. In adoration God gazes upon us and we gaze back upon him. Throughout the day, the church too is almost always occupied by a parishioner in silent prayer. All this coupled with the many personal private prayers at homes allows us to connect with God in a personal and relational way.

Jesus says, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matt 18:20) God's fundamental small group is the family. In our parish we have a growing program called Domestic Church. Through this program married couples come together on a regular basis for time of prayer, fellowship and formation. Currently we have three circles with about 6 couples in each circle. A priest also joins during each of the meetings. Small groups are also being formed through Evangelical Catholic, which equips members of our community to put into action the formation of small groups/ministries. We also have the Carmelites, the Secular Franciscans and service orientated missions such as St. Vincent de Paul. The Bible Studies and other opportunities to both serve and minister within our parish all cumulatively allow members of our parish to gather amongst others to share the faith, for where 2 or 3 are gathered, Jesus is in our midst.

Finally, we have the Liturgy. It is in Holy Mass where the whole community gathers in fellowship with God, in the sacrifice of Jesus offered to the Father. Our daily Mass is attended regularly by about 80 people. Our Sunday Mass attendance during this month of October has averaged around 1000 persons. It is in the Holy Liturgy of Mass that we encounter Christ and are filled by Word and Sacrament to bring Jesus to our community and our neighbors.

These three areas: one-on-one time with Jesus, small groups, and Holy Liturgy allow our parish to be a place where the Holy Spirit can work and our faith and community can flourish. I encourage each of you to continue connecting to these three vital areas within our parish. The more we get connected to Christ, the source of all life, the more we will be the witnesses of joy bringing others back to our churches and back to the Love of Jesus.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish. Fr. Thelen
