FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: The month of November is traditionally a time in which the Catholic community remembers those who have died. It is related to the fact that the end of November is the end of the Liturgical Year with a new year starting the First Sunday of Advent. The Church uses this end of the year period as a time to think of the end of life and the end of all things and the great hope that our earthly end is transition into a new life in God's heavenly reality.

This past week on November 2nd we had a special Mass remembering all of our beloved parishioners who have passed away. Our prayers for the deceased continue throughout this month as we remember all of our dead. The readings for the Masses will also begin to reflect the final events of the world. Therefore, as we come to the end of the Church year, we are asked to consider the end times, our own as well as the world's. The culmination of the liturgical year is the Feast of Christ the King on November 26th. (Prayers for the Souls in Purgatory also happen in our parish every Tuesday at 7:30am. All are welcome to attend.)

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us about the state of purification called Purgatory (paragraph 1031). As imperfect, fallen human beings, we might not be completely spotless of venial sin when we die and that is why His love continues to purify us in the state of Purgatory. What's left of sin or our attachment to sin is taken away in Purgatory. The afterlife doesn't necessarily have a sense of time, so when someone speaks of time in Purgatory, it's just us finite humans attempting to understand the duration of Purgatory in our own human terms. While we are still living, we should prepare ourselves to be rid of all sin as much as possible through prayer, Confession, and constant conversion.

This month of November is an important time to pray for all of the souls in Purgatory. The month concludes with the great Feast of Christ the King, for "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:10-11)

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish. Fr. Thelen


