FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: The following reflection on Thanksgiving and the Eucharist is taken from Aleteia, an online Catholic media source. ~ As we prepare this week to celebrate Thanksgiving Day it is interesting to note that the Greek-derived word for thanksgiving is "eucharist," the same word that we use to describe the Blessed Sacrament.

It's no surprise, then, that many Catholics make a point of beginning their Thanksgiving Day with a visit to church, even though it is a civil holiday and not a religious day of obligation. "The whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Eucharistic sacrifice and the sacraments," the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains. It is called Eucharist "because it is an action of thanksgiving to God. The Greek words eucharistein and eulogein recall the Jewish blessings that proclaim —especially during a meal— God's works: creation, redemption, and sanctification." (CCC 1328)

"The name 'Eucharist,' or thanksgiving, is to be explained either by the fact that at its institution Christ "gave thanks," or by the fact that this is the supreme act of Christian gratitude to God," writes Jesuit Fr. John A. Hardon in his Catholic Catechism. "Early instances of this title occur in the Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, in the letters of St. Ignatius of Antioch, and in the Apologies of St. Justin."

St. John Vianney had a special devotion to the Eucharist. In one of his meditations, he wrote of the spirit of thanksgiving after receiving Communion: "When we leave the altar rails we are as happy as the Magi would have been if they had been able to carry off the Infant Jesus."

Another saint, St. Peter Julian Eymard, is known as the Saint of the Eucharist. In fact, he founded a religious order, the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, whose mission is to share the riches of God's love manifested in the Eucharist. St. Peter Julian gets to the heart of the matter when he writes that the highest form of thanksgiving the devout Christian can make in response to the Eucharist is a complete gift of himself. "Belong entirely to God through love, entirely to your neighbor through a gracious charity, entirely to the divine Eucharist by the offering and sacrifice of your whole self," he wrote. "Bear with yourself in the patience of our Lord." And that can be done every day, not only on Thanksgiving. ~ May you and your family be blessed this Thanksgiving Day and may your love for the Holy Eucharist continue to grow.

We at the St John's conference provide service to our friends and neighbors in need through home visits where we offer our time, talents, or treasure and also through our special works. The special works are the Outreach, Thrift Store, food pantry, fellowship meals, and the free medical clinic. No work of charity should be foreign to the members and include any form of help that alleviates suffering or deprivation and promotes human dignity and personal integrity. With the rise in the cost of living we have seen a significant increase in requests for help. The majority of these requests come from people who are working but are living from paycheck to paycheck. One unexpected cost or tragedy, be it medical treatment, car repair, job loss, or some other unforeseen issue can start a downward spiral. We try to stop the spiral from going out of control.

From Jan 1, 2023, to today, we have provided over \$6500 in furniture vouchers, \$26,000 in clothing vouchers, and over \$20,000 in mattress vouchers. We have also paid out almost \$93,000 in housing/emergency shelter assistance. We served 3978 families in our food pantry. Our fellowship meals feed between 40-70 people every Monday and Wednesday, we also paid for four car repairs. None of this would have been possible if not for the donations we received from the parish and the community. Whether you donated food, materials, money, or time it is greatly appreciated by us and our friends and the neighbors in need we serve. **THANK YOU!**
