### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This weekend we celebrate Christmas. As Catholics this celebration is not just a one -day event. The season of Christmas extends all the way to the Baptism of Our Lord on the 8<sup>th</sup> of January. The first eight days of this Christmas season, the Octave of Christmas, is treated within the liturgy with as much solemnity as the day of Christmas. As we pass through these many days of the Christmas season, we should focus deeply upon preparing our hearts for Jesus and inviting Him into our lives.

For most people, Christmas preparation meant buying gifts and preparing food. The most important preparation, however, is the preparation of the soul. When Jesus came into the world, there was no fancy banquet. He came into the world in simplicity. He revealed himself to the humble shepherds, to the faithful wiseman, and to the saintly Mary and Joseph. Have you prepared your soul for the coming of Jesus? Are you faithfully saying your prayers? Are you practicing virtue, charity and following the commandments? Have you gone to Confession? Are you attending Mass?

St. John the Baptist shows us an ideal way to prepare our hearts for Jesus. St. John the Baptist prepared the world for the coming of Jesus by announcing the coming of the Lord. To do this he proclaimed Jesus to others. If we love Jesus, we should do the same. During your days are you talking about Jesus? Are you sharing Jesus with others? I am going to make a bold challenge. Is it possible for you to speak about Jesus in 50 percent of your conversations? Could this be a goal of yours? Do you think it is possible? Or is this a ridiculous thing to consider?

There are hundreds of ways to do this. This could be as simple as praising the Lord by saying Thanks be to God. You could comment on the weather and give thanks to God for such a good day. Many cultures include expressions about God in their greetings and their farewells. There are many ways to share about Jesus. If you love Jesus, this will happen naturally. Do not force it. Love Jesus, love the person in front of you, and words about Jesus will naturally arise in your conversation. It becomes as common as breathing. When we speak about Jesus, we receive Life. The Holy Spirit fills us and we rejoice in the Lord. Make it your goal. Be like John the Baptist and speak about Jesus. Rejoice always in the Lord. Praise him always!

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish.


