FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: Imagine losing your Mom at the age of three, being married at nineteen, a widow by twenty-eight, raising your five children on your own, and then starting a convent and a Catholic school. This is the story of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. This coming Thursday, January 4th, we celebrate the Optional Memorial of this great saint. (Her image is depicted in the dome above the altar of our church.) St. Elizabeth is the first American born citizen to be canonized a saint. Born and raised in the Episcopal faith, she experienced a profound conversion during a visit to Italy. It was here that her husband died. But it was also here that she experienced the profound faith of an Italian couple that led her to the Eucharist in 1805.

St. Elizabeth experienced intense pressure from her family not to convert to Catholicism. Her growing love for the Eucharist and the Sacraments for the Sick, however, moved her beyond her fear. With her conversion she wrote, "I will go peaceably and firmly to the Catholic Church: for if faith is so important to our salvation, I will seek it where true Faith first began, seek it among those who received it from God Himself." She looked forward with great anticipation to receiving the Sacraments for the first time. After her First Communion she wrote, "At last... at last, GOD IS MINE AND I AM HIS! Now, let all go its round - I Have Received Him."

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. It is the very real presence of Jesus in this world. We as Catholics are so blessed to have the Eucharist. It provides us with graces in our every struggle. We receive Communion at church so that we can form communion with God.

As we celebrate today the Holy Family and next week the Epiphany and the conclusion of the Christmas season, I ask our Lord to increase our devotion to the Eucharist in our parishes, to his real presence here on earth. Through his real presence in the Eucharist, we are strengthened in innumerable ways. In next week's bulletin column, I will highlight the special ways that we as a parish will be focusing upon the Eucharist in this the 2nd year of the National Eucharistic Revival. In this New Year please reaffirm your commitment to attending Mass every Sunday, and please encourage others also to do the same. Untold graces are present at each and every Holy Mass.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

I remember the first time my older sister asked me if I wanted to hold her newborn son. Terrified, I told her I didn't think it was a good idea. My résumé had nothing to suggest I would be a qualified baby holder. But she warmly told me, "I'll help you hold him." It struck me that she is baby's mother. She is the one who decides who is qualified to hold him. I took him in my arms and soon I began to feel comfortable with that tiny little warm cooing creature in my arms, and soon I no longer feared holding him. Now, twenty-seven nieces and nephews later, holding a newborn child is one of the great joys of my life.

Do we sometimes think that Jesus is given only to the highly qualified, special religious people? In the Gospel of Luke today we hear about the presentation of the Lord in the temple. The newborn son of God is passed around like a baton in a relay race, not guarded like a precious jewel or a breakable china dish. We can see him going from the arms of Mary to Joseph, then to the priest performing the ceremony, then to Simeon the old man, then to Anna the old widow. Each one receiving him and then handing him to the next. A tidal wave of joy and thanksgiving follows wherever he is placed.

Believe me, you are qualified to hold Jesus in your arms. How can I say that with such confidence? Because the mother decides who is qualified. The Blessed Virgin, embodied in the Church, holds him out to you and me. She rejoices to place him in our arms to hold, and to hand him on, too.
