FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: Where did the Bible come from? Where is the Bible's origin? Many people do not ponder this question. Many people just assume that the Bible has always existed making the general assumption that God gave the Bible to us, like he gave Moses the Ten Commandments. Thus, I want to provide clarity in regard to the origin of the Bible.

First of all, there are two parts to the Bible. The Old and the New Testament. The Old Testament has 46 books. These books, which outline God's Creation, the life of Moses, and the writings of the prophets, were compiled by the Jewish people before the coming of Christ. Jesus himself used these books and quoted from them during his ministry.

The New Testament has 27 books. The New Testament describes the period of time that follows the life of Jesus. These 27 books communicate the public revelation of Christ. The Church teaches that public revelation ended with the death of the last apostle, who was Saint John the Apostle.

Jesus, himself, never wrote anything. The 27 books of the New Testament were written by a variety of authors including St. Paul, St. Mark and St. Luke and many of the apostles. These twenty-seven books were not given directly to us from God, but rather the Holy Spirit inspired the holy authors to write in a manner that was free of error and filled with divine inspiration. It was the job of the Church then to determine which books were valid and should be included in the Bible. This final list was compiled and approved by Roman Catholic Bishops in the fourth century. These 27 books were all compiled within the first one-hundred years of the Church. No additional books can be added to the Bible.

Perhaps you are thinking that this then was easy. The Bishops found these twenty-seven books and just approved them. Yet this is not the case. St. Paul speaks about individuals who were spreading false teachings and false gospels. In the first one-hundred years of the Church many false teachers wrote false books about Jesus. The early Church, therefore, had to make a determination. They had to declare some books worthy of inclusion in the Bible and some books unworthy. To be continued next week... :)
