FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners of St. John the Baptist, Jesus in the Gospels warns us many times to watch out for the leaven of the Pharisees and the leaven of King Herod. It is interesting to note the significant detail that Jesus does not warn us directly about the Pharisees and King Herod. It is rather that he warns us about the leaven. Why? Why should we be on our guard against leaven?

Jesus is using leaven in this passage as a symbol for sin. Anyone who bakes knows that leaven is almost invisible to the naked eye when mixed with dough, but when heated the leaven causes a great change, causing the bread to quickly rise. Sin is much the same. It is the sinful example and corrupt teaching of both King Herod and the Pharisees that Jesus says is like leaven. Their teaching entered within and polluted the mind. As we begin our Lenten season, may we be conscious of the leaven in our own lives that may be drawing us away from our Lord.


Many ask the question. Why have the young drifted away from church? Why have the youth abandoned the faith of their parents and grandparents? Much of the answer is because the leaven of this world has crept into their lives. In the music, the media, the friends, the messages of society. Our culture is abuzz with words that contradict the Gospel. These words and messages are like the leaven of corruption entering within.

Prayer, constant prayer, is the perfect shield. It protects us and our families from this evil. Prayer is spiritual but it is also very human. Prayer heals us. Prayer does not separate us from the world. Rather prayer heals us so that we can be more present to the world, drawing the world back to the holiness for which it was made.

Because the leaven of corruption is so omnipresent, we must be vigilant about what we hear with our ears and see with our eyes. First keep guard over your own self. Choose to turn off the bad shows and the corrupt music. Choose silence over the immoral noise. Listen to God's voice. Immerse yourself into the Holy Word. Clean your own heart first. Then begin to clean your home. Lead your family with love. Make your home a sanctuary. Cast out from your home the bad music, the corrupt shows, and all the leaven of the world that leads to death.

This Lent invite into your home the silence of God and the holy noise of conversation, of sharing, of talking, of passing time with loved ones. Do the normal human things of cleaning, cooking and relaxing - do them together with your family. Invite into your home the peace of Christ. Cast out the leaven of the world. Reject sin in your life. Then do what is holy. Plant within your life and your home the seed of Christ and your home will experience true blessings.

wander at Mass because we only see bread and wine. What contributes to our distractions is the hombardment of poise and images of

the bombardment of noise and images on our mind that come through our physical senses (hearing, seeing). Therefore, we are much less attuned to the world of the spirit and the much deeper spiritual realities that are right here, all around us.



Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, help me to learn to be quiet and reveal to my heart the truth that the Eucharist is really You present under the appearance of bread and wine.

This week, read about Jacob in the desert, who was very much afraid, and came to realize that God was present right there with him. As with Jacob, we can say as we pray before the Blessed Sacrament, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it." (Genesis 28:10-17)
