FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: Pope Francis recently released a Vatican document entitled 'Infinite Dignity'. Last week I shared some of this document. The following are a few more highlights from this important teaching from our Holy Father. You are welcome to read the full document online.

Every human person possesses an infinite dignity, inalienably grounded in his or her very being, which prevails in and beyond every circumstance, state, or situation the person may ever encounter. (1)

To clarify the concept of dignity even further, it is essential to point out that dignity is not something granted to the person by others based on their gifts or qualities.... All human beings possess this same intrinsic dignity, regardless of whether or not they can express it in a suitable manner. (15)

The Church insists that the dignity of every human person, because it is intrinsic, remains circumstances.".... The only prerequisite for speaking about the dignity inherent in the person is their membership in the human species, whereby "the rights of the person are the rights of man" (24)

While the concept of dignity is reserved for the human being, at the same time, the creaturely goodness of the rest of the cosmos must be affirmed. As Pope Francis points out, "By virtue of our unique dignity and our gift of intelligence, we are called to respect creation and its inherent laws [...], 'Each creature possesses its own particular goodness and perfection...Each of the various creatures, willed in its own being, reflects in its own way a ray of God's infinite wisdom and goodness. Man must therefore respect the particular goodness of every creature, to avoid any disordered use of things." (28)

Detached from the Creator, our freedom can only weaken and become obscured. The illusion that moral relativism provides the key for peaceful coexistence is actually the origin of divisions and the denial of the dignity of human beings." (30)

Human trafficking must also be counted among the grave violations of human dignity. While it is not a new phenomenon, it has taken on tragic dimensions before our eyes, which is why Pope Francis has denounced it in particularly emphatic terms: "I reaffirm here that the 'trade in people' is a vile activity, a disgrace to our societies that claim to be civilized!" (41)

The Church consistently reminds us that "the dignity of every human being has an intrinsic character and is valid from the moment of conception until natural death...Unborn children are, thus, "the most defenseless and innocent among us. (47)

The Church also takes a stand against the practice of surrogacy, through which the immensely worthy child becomes a mere object. On this point, Pope Francis's words have a singular clarity: "A child is always a gift and never the basis of a commercial contract. Consequently, I express my hope for an effort by the international community to prohibit this practice universally." The child has the right to have a fully human (and not artificially induced) origin and to receive the gift of a life that manifests both the dignity of the giver and that of the receiver. (48-49)

Regarding Euthanasia or assisted suicide the document says -Helping the suicidal person to take his or her own life is an objective offense against the dignity of the person asking for it, even if one would be thereby fulfilling the person's wish: "(52)
