The Parish Office will be closed on Friday, June 7th due to the Eucharistic Rally in La Crosse, Wi.

Mass Intentions - the stipends for Masses has remained the same for over 30 years throughout the Dioceses of Wisconsin. Recently when the Bishops of the state of Wisconsin gathered, they decreed that the stipends should be adjusted. Mass stipends will now be \$20 (formerly \$10). The new fee will take place immediately. All Masses currently scheduled are exempt from this increase. As always, Mass stipends are paid to the parish and not the priest directly. Thank you!

Please note the following guidelines on scheduling a Mass:

- \Diamond Only one scheduled intention can be booked per Mass. This one scheduled intention can have no more than three names within the intention.
- A family can book no more than four scheduled Masses per \Diamond person in a calendar year and only two of those can be weekend Masses.
- \Diamond Masses for 2025 are nearly booked. Only weekday Masses are left. The 2026 calendar will open in January of 2025.

Pie & Ice Cream! Civic Band concerts will be held on Wednesdays in Columbia Park beginning June 19th and running through July 31st. St. John's PCCW will again be selling pie and ice cream during the concerts, as a fundraiser. Ladies of the parish may receive a call asking if they'll provide a pie or ice cream. Mission Co-Op Envelopes: For those receiving the monthly packets of tithing envelopes, you will have received the Mission Co-Op envelope in the June packet. Mission Co-Op envelopes can be found in the envelope holders in the entryways for anyone who does not receive the monthly packet. Fr. Senn from St. Joseph's in Stratford will be with us the weekend of July 27th - 28th sharing with us the needs of his mission. More information will be coming.

Sunday Mass & Healing Service - St. Matthew, Wausau, will celebrate Sunday Mass followed by communal and individual prayer for health and healing on Sunday, June 9th at 3:30pm. The sacrament of reconciliation will be available prior to Mass.

Dear Parishioners: As we get to know our new bishop, the following is the description of Bishop Battersby's new Coat of Arms.

The great seal of the Diocese of La Crosse is on a field of silver. The three wavy bands at the bottom represent the three rivers flowing through the Diocese of La Crosse - the Mississippi, Wisconsin and Chippewa rivers. The cross of gold within the canoe symbolizes the travels of the early Jesuit missionaries through the Diocese and the faith they brought to the area. Below the left arm of the cross is a lacrosse racket, from the game played by Native Americans who first inhabited the territory. Below the right arm is a sheaf of wheat, indicating the predominantly rural nature of the Diocese. The wheat is also a symbol of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The remainder of the Diocesan side of the shield is occupied by three hills of green behind the cross, representing the bluffs and hills found in the Diocese.

For the personal coat of arms, His Excellency, Gerard W. Battersby, has adopted a design reflecting his personal heritage, spirituality and ministry. At the top of the shield is a Celtic processional cross meant to honor Bishop Battersby's Irish heritage. It is shaped like a traditional cross but with a ring, representing the sun, around the intersection of the stem and arms. The whole cross is decorated with ornate Gaelic patterns. Bishop Battersby's Coat of Arms includes the three Sacred Hearts. The hearts represent the Holy Family and symbolize the unending and boundless love for us.

The wounded heart signifies his devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It also pays tribute to Sacred Heart Major Seminary where he prepared for the priesthood and at which he served as vice-rector and dean of seminarian formation at the time he was called to the episcopacy. The second heart, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, signifies the trust and confidence that Bishop Battersby has in the Blessed Mother's intercession and protection. The sword symbolizes the sorrows of Mary, the flames represent her burning love for Jesus and us, her children and the roses represent her purity. Bishop Battersby's devotion to St. Joseph is represented in the third of the Sacred Hearts, the Chaste Heart of Joseph, inflamed with love and adorned with the white lily of purity, a symbol of his faith and steadiness.

Bishop Battersby's motto is found in the Gospel of St. John, Chapter 1, verse 18, which reads, "No one has ever seen God. The only Son, God who is at the Father's side has revealed him." Surrounding the

shield is the pontifical hat called the "galero" with its six tassels, in three rows, on either side of the shield, all in green. These are the heraldic insignia of a prelate of the rank of bishop.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us, our new bishop and our parish.



Jesus Thirsts Coming to Rogers Cinema in Marshfield A new



film focusing on the transformative power of the Eucharist will be showing at Rogers Cinema in Marshfield on June 4th, 5th, and 6th at 7:00pm each night (The showing on June 6th will have Spanish subtitles). Jesus Thirsts: The Miracle of the Eucharist will take viewers on a journey to rediscover the importance of the Eucharist through dialogue with notable Catholic figures including Father Donald Calloway, Scott Hahn, Jim Wahlberg, Curtis Martin, Chris Stefanick, Father Robert


Spitzer, Bishop Andrew Cozzens, and Tim Gray, among others. Deacon Steve Greco, the executive producer of the film, explained that amid the ongoing Eucharistic Revival in the U.S., he felt it was "very critical that we have a movie focusing on the real presence of Jesus with top Catholic theologians and leaders." Greco added that they partnered with the Knights of Columbus to add a 13-minute adjunctive film, produced by the Knights of Columbus, titled *Our* Lady of Guadalupe: Woman of the Eucharist. The short film will air after Jesus Thirsts and explores the centrality of the Eucharist in that famous Marian apparition. He added, "We really believe that every priest, every deacon, every bishop, every Catholic needs to see this."



KEY Explained

* = Procession begins at the **Wisdot Park & Ride (A)** located at the corner of Heritage Drive and S. Draxler's Drive (South of Kwik Trip). Entrance to the Park & Ride is off of S. Draxler's Drive

The procession will follow the Bike/Walking path along Veteran's Pkwy, cross Central Avenue and continue to N. Chestnut Avenue (right turn off of Veteran's Pkwy), crossing W. Arnold Street & W. Blodgett Street

= Procession ends at **St. John the Baptist Church [**SJB**] (201 W. Blodgett St.). The Procession will enter into SJB Church via the Blodgett Street doors. Benediction will follow.

Transportation Arrangements for Eucharistic Procession Participants

- To participate in the Eucharistic Procession, please park your vehicle in the Parking Lot North of (behind) St. John the Baptist Church (entrance is off of S. Chestnut Avenue).
- 2. Eucharistic Procession participants will be "shuttled" to Altar Stop at which you would like to join the Procession (See above for Altar Stop Locations / Distance between Stops, etc.).
 - a. The Park 'n Ride has limited parking capacity (*It is a workday/regular patrons will be parking here*).
 - b. This allows for immediate access to your vehicle at the completion of the Eucharistic Procession.
- 3. Shuttles will be available throughout the entire duration of the Eucharistic Procession.
 - a. Shuttles = Vans / Cars with a SIGN, i.e., Eucharistic Procession Transportation with Monstrance.
 - b. Multiple Shuttles will be available. Shuttles will travel "in rotation". Shuttle(s) will be traveling to an Altar Stop(s) and then returning to SJB Parking Lot while a Shuttle(s) will be loading passengers and depart when the Shuttle that has completed its round trip returns to SJB Parking Lot.
- 4. Golf Cart will follow the Procession if a participant is unable to complete the walk, need to rest, etc.
- 5. We encourage you to carry water with you. Emergency supply will be available if needed.

Please prepare for the weather. **We will process RAIN or SHINE**. If unsafe., lightning, etc. we will not process. All other activities will proceed as detailed on the Monday, June 10 / Tuesday, June 11 schedule.
