

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: I want to share an update on Chalice of Mercy. As many of you know I have been part of this mission since 2011. It was founded by my good friend Valentyna Pavsyukova in 2007. She experienced a powerful conversion right here in Marshfield in an apartment on Central Avenue. A Youtube search of her name will offer a number of videos on her conversion.

Our mission is the following: "God is Our Father and He has a very special, personal and deep love for each one of us. Our hope is that through our prayer and action, we might reveal the treasured dignity that each one of us has before Him. We serve and protect all human rights and life from the moment of conception until natural death. We organize medical assistance to the most impoverished hospitals, hospices and orphanages in Ukraine. We reach out with support, help and relief to children with special needs. We help single mothers and families that find themselves in the most difficult situations. But most of all. our hope is that through His works, Our Father might be known, loved and honored throughout the world."

Since the start of the war, we have helped in bringing donated medical and humanitarian aid valued at millions of dollars to the suffering peoples in Ukraine. Currently the Ukrainian people have plenty of food and clothing. However, the most essential items needed are medicines and medical products. We work with several large NGO's who collect and distribute medical product. Our main expense is the shipping of these products to Ukraine.

Valentyna is an American citizen but is native to Ukraine. In March she returned to her hometown of Zaporyzhye and has been there ever since. She and a local team of volunteers manage the donated product and frequently drive to the front lines to distribute the emergency aid to the wounded. She speaks about the flying drones and the proximate shelling. Please pray for her and her team's safety. Many times she meets civilians or soldiers and then shortly thereafter hears of their deaths. It is not easy.

Last Fall we assisted financially in giving prosthetics to one wounded soldier and to a nurse who was a young mother. Just recently Valentyna took a group of about 20 women on retreat to Medjugorje. These women suffered torture and rape in the Russian occupied territory. One cannot imagine their suffering.

I serve as secretary for the mission and oversee all the bookkeeping and make sure all the proper filings occur for our 501(c)3 status. This mission has been dear to me for over a decade. The suffering in Ukraine is immense and I feel it deeply. Please continue to pray for peace.

May St John the Baptist pray for our parish and all the peoples suffering in this world.


