FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This coming Tuesday we celebrate *the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel*. In our parish we have a Secular Carmelite Order. This group is an association of lay persons, of both men and women, whose members, responding to a special call of God, freely and deliberately commit themselves "to live in the following of Jesus Christ" according to the Carmelite tradition. Our Secular Carmelite Order meets in the church for prayers and Mass on the evening of the 2nd Mondays of the month. All are welcome to join.

Many of you also likely wear a brown scapular. This is a very common tradition among Catholics. I have worn a brown scapular since my youth and feel it is a quiet yet powerful way to remind myself of my faith and of my closeness to Our Lady. Tradition tells us that in 1251, Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock at Aylesford, England. In this apparition, Our Lady gave him what we call the brown Scapular... a garment that has become the symbol of the bond between us and Our Lady.

The brown scapular was given to the world through the Carmelites so that all her sons and daughters could wear an outward sign of her love for them. As a "cloak" of grace and love, the Scapular represents the protection and security we find in our heavenly mother's love. Our Lady has given us her Scapular to wear; a garment of special concern a sign of belonging. Her Scapular is a mantle of grace and love.

Mary expressed her total openness to the will of God when she said, "Be it done to me according to your word." The message of the Scapular is to always follow Christ in faith, hope and charity. Christ is the source of all truth and holiness, and the graces we receive through Mary's intercession come from Him, to lead us to Him.

The Scapular is a constant reminder of Mary's presence in our lives. Through the symbol of the Scapular we strive to live and die as friends of God. This is the substance of the Scapular Promise. Just as we receive a special garment at our baptism to express being "clothed in Christ," it is often at First Communion that a child is given the brown scapular, a new "cloak" representing the child's growing faith. As a child I don't remember a special ceremony, but I feel it was around the age of my First Communion that I began wearing the brown scapular. The beautiful custom of enrolling children in the Scapular puts them, in their innocence, under the tender care of their heavenly mother. The Church considers the Scapular a miniature religious habit and, as such, it is a highly indulgenced sacramental. We wear Our Lady's Scapular as a loving response, a "YES"! to her desire that we keep Jesus as the center of our lives and bring Him to others.

May St. John the Baptist pray for our parish and all the peoples suffering in this world.

Encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. He waits for you!

The Eucharist is called the Memorial of the Lord's Death and Resurrection

Jesus instructed the apostles at the last supper to "do this in memory of

Me." The Eucharist is a memorial, but this means much more than recalling something to mind, or remembering an event from the past. "In Sacred Scripture, the memorial is not merely the recollection of past events." At Mass, specific events from the life of Christ become present and real so that our lives may be conformed to them. "When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, She commemorates Christ's Passover [Jesus passing over from death to life], and it is made present: the sacrifice of Christ offered once for all on the Cross remains ever present" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs 1363, 1364). So, never forget the true meaning of the word "Memorial."

Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

Jesus, please help me prepare beforehand to enter into the Memorial—the making present of Your death and resurrection at Mass.

This week, read how St. Paul describes the Last Supper in 1 Corinthians 11:23-26.


