#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This coming week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast honors the incredible gift that Our Lady received, that upon her death she was assumed both body and soul into heaven. This grace shows the promise that we too will enjoy, if we die in his grace. For at the time of Our Lord's second coming our bodies too will join with our souls in heaven. This Feast also reminds me that the end of summer is near. In my high school years, I always remember the Assumption falling during 2-a-day football practices. In the sweltering August heat, it was always a relief to get out of one of these practices to attend Mass. I went to a public school, but I am glad my coach was amenable to my absence so that my brother and I could attend Mass. I pray that you also will find time to attend Mass on the Feast of the Assumption. This is a Holy Day of Obligation, and apart from frail health, sickness or the caring of infants or others who are ill, attendance at Mass on this day is an obligation.

In this column I also want to mention the following tragedy that occurred to one of my former parishioners, a Hispanic from Alma Center. His name is Marcos. At the end of July, this young father and husband, was engaged in his normal job of driving a semi to Chicago. In a tragic moment he was hit by a car while walking across a road in Chicago to get back to his semi after getting food at a gas station. The car was going the wrong way into traffic and swerved to miss oncoming cars and hit him going high-speed. The driver got out to look at Marcos bleeding in the street and then got back into his car and fled. The hit-and-run is being investigated and has been on televised news but officials have yet to identify the driver. The car did not have license plates. A bystander performed CPR and was able to assist until the ambulance came. Marcos is in critical care and will have a craniotomy to remove part of his skull to accommodate the swelling of his brain. He is still sedated and intubated as the brain swelling is addressed. His injuries are extensive and this will likely be the first of a series of surgeries. His wife Whitney asks for prayers as he has a long road ahead. Also, if anyone would like to assist financially, checks can be made out to the 'Marcos Sanchez Benefit' and dropped off at the office or into the collection. Thank you for your prayers, especially in this time of this family's great need.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us, our parish and the whole world.


