#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **Dear Parishioners:**

Last weekend I spoke about St. Anthony of Padua, the patron saint of lost items. He is known for his incredible gift of preaching. He also had a wonderful gift of sharing the truths of God's love. The following prayer is known as St. Anthony's Motto. It was so well-known that Pope Sixtus V, some 300 years following the death of St. Anthony of Padua, etched this prayer on the famed obelisk located in the center of St. Peter's square in Rome.

Ecce Crucem Domini! Fugite partes adversae! Vicit Leo de tribu Juda. Radix David! Alleluia!

Behold the Cross of the Lord! Be gone all evil powers! The Lion of the tribe of Judah, The root of David has conquered! Alleluia!

The power of Jesus' name is absolute. "At the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:10-11)

This past week on September 14th, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, was the 17th anniversary of the founding of the mission of Chalice of Mercy, which I have been a part of for nearly two decades. Earlier this year my friend and the foundress of our mission, Valentyna, took Ukrainian women who were raped by Russian soldiers to Medjugorje for a special retreat of healing. This week she is travelling with Ukrainian men who were tortured by Russian soldiers on a similar retreat to Medjugorje. I ask you to please pray for these individuals who have experienced such terrible tragedies. The horrors of war are absolutely devastating, but the grace of Jesus is stronger. May the whole world experience the grace and power of Jesus' salvation.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and our parish and the whole world.

Do you want to know the Holy Spirit as comforter, healer, counselor, peacemaker and evangelizer?


Do you desire to see our Church transformed?
