#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: During my time as a seminarian in Rome I completed a book on the relics of the saints. The book is still available on Amazon and my website for the work can be found at saintsinrome.com. During my research, I tried to provide locations and details on all the saints from our liturgical calendar. I have not continued this research in the past few years as I came to understand that this detail of research was a stresser for me. However, I grew to greatly appreciate the intercession of the saints and our Catholic veneration of relics. To me it is a very important practicum demonstrating the truths of both the Incarnation and our body/soul unity. For the next few bulletin columns, I will share my writings on St. Luke, as his feast day is in October. If this information is enjoyed, perhaps a couple times a year, I will share more historical information on the saints. For instance, the entry on St. John the Baptist is very interesting.

St. Luke was a native of Antioch. He is thought to have been a physician since St. Paul refers to him as such in his Letter to the Colossians. His upbringing as a Gentile makes him unique amongst the Gospel writers. A medieval tradition also depicts him as a skilled painter. As a result, numerous portraits of the Blessed Virgin Mary are attributed to him. In his ministry he often accompanied St. Paul as is recorded by the 'we sections' in the Acts of the Apostles. Likewise, he was with Paul in Rome as is indicated in both the Letter to the Colossians and the Letter to Philemon. Following the death of St. Paul nothing is known for certain of St. Luke. According to the historian Julius Africanus, St. Luke wrote his Gospel in Achaia and died in Bœotia, both regions of the Greek peninsula. One tradition claims that he died as a martyr being hung from an olive tree in the city of Thebes.
