FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: I am thankful for the many different ways that our students receive education through public schools, home schooling, Family Faith Formation, and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This week is Catholic Schools week and in a particular way we celebrate the gift of our education in Catholic schools. On Thursday Bishop Battersby will be visiting our students at Columbus and celebrating a Mass for them. The students also have activities each day throughout the week to celebrate the gift of Catholic Schools. On Wednesday of this week, we will be having a special Flag raising ceremony at our flagpole. The students will be invited to participate as our nation's flag is raised and blessed.

I have been involved in Catholic schools for the last ten years as a priest. It fascinates me to recall, however, how oblivious I was to the existence of Catholic schools in my earlier years. When I grew up, I attended public school. The nearest Catholic school would have been over an hour away. We never competed against any Catholic schools in sports as the Catholic schools had separate playoffs.

I was somehow also completely ignorant of the entire Catholic university system. I knew that Notre Dame existed, but when I was 18 and looking for colleges, I wanted to stay local and only explored the UW systems. It was not until I was 25 and visiting my sister in the Twin Cities, that I discovered the whole history of Catholic education. My sister lived near the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. During my visit to her, I remember stopping into this university just to see it. I distinctly remember how fascinated I was upon entering. I could not believe my eyes to see statues of saints and of Our Lord within the buildings and throughout the campus of this university. I was blown away that a Catholic presence would be in a place of education!

This story sounds almost preposterous. I practiced my faith all throughout my youth and into my 20's. I knew the sacraments and I knew the church was true; however, I had no connection to the many rich traditions of our faith. In time I learned that it was the Catholic Church that really birthed the education system in the West. The Greeks and Latins had education systems in their day. But in their collapse, it was the cathedral schools that grew up around various monasteries of Europe that began the education system in the West. Bologna, Oxford, Cambridge, Paris are some of the earliest.

Today's Catholic education continues this tradition. We give thanks for this gift in our community. We thank the many teachers and staff members who sacrifice and make this gift possible.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and bless us.

The 2025 Jubilee is a Catholic holy year that began on Christmas Eve, 2024 and ends on Epiphany, 2026. The year's theme is "Pilgrims of Hope". Characteristics of a jubilee year include pilgrimage, reconciliation and prayer. Bishop Battersby has designated the following churches in the La Crosse Diocese as pilgrimage sites:

- Sacred Heart of Jesus, Eau Claire,
- · Church of the Resurrection, Wausau,
- Sacred Heart of Jesus, Nekoosa.

JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Jubilee 2025 was proclaimed by Pope Francis in the Papal Bull *Spes Non Confundit* ("Hope does not disappoint").

"The coming Jubilee will thus be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God. May it help us to recover the confident trust that we require, in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation." (Pope Francis, *Spes Non Confundit* 25)

The jubilee will begin in Rome on the vigil of the Lord's Nativity on Dec. 24, 2024 with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica, and in local dioceses on Holy Family Sunday on Dec. 29. It will conclude in local dioceses the following Holy Family Sunday on Dec. 28, 2025, and in Rome on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, Jan. 6, 2026, with the closing of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica.

HALLMARKS OF THE JUBILEE

Jubilee Indulgence: Special graces for the forgiveness of the temporal punishment due for sins are made available during the Jubilee Year. The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence – remission of all temporal punishment (time in Purgatory) for sin—by meeting the normal conditions (confession, Holy Communion, prayer for the pope's intentions, and no attachment to sin) and by participating in one of the following activities:

Pilgrimages: The four major basilicas in Rome are the main pilgrimage destinations, but pilgrims may also go to the Holy Land, their diocesan cathedral or other officially designated locations

Pious visits to sacred places: At these locations, the faithful are to engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, among other spiritual practices.

Works of mercy and penance: The faithful are to perform the spiritual or corporal works of mercy or carry out works of penance, such as abstaining from meat on Fridays.

Holy Doors: The pope opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica at the beginning of each jubilee year. Passing through the holy doors symbolizes the pilgrim's journey of conversion.

Papal Basilicas: The pope will open the Holy Doors of the four main churches (called "major basilicas") in Rome: St. Peter's Basilica, St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN JUBILEE 2025

- Make a pilgrimage to Rome. Some dioceses, parishes and other organizations will be coordinating pilgrimages, but you may also go on your own.
- Participate in a local celebration of the jubilee. Some dioceses, parishes and other organizations will coordinate local celebrations for those unable to travel to Rome.
- Obtain the Jubilee Indulgence through one of the other means (works of mercy and penance, making a pilgrimage to your cathedral, etc.).

Pray for the pope, the Church and all who take part in the jubilee.


