THE DEACON IS SPEAKIN'

I think it is fitting that we start the New Year off by celebrating the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. We, as Catholics, begin each year by honoring Jesus' mother under her title of "Mother of God". We do this to remind ourselves that, from the very moment of conception, Jesus was fully God and fully man. He is one person with two natures, one divine and one human. He is fully God and fully man not part God and part man.



There will be no rioting, no looting, no destruction of personal property, no violence, just good people whose love of God and love for you brings them to march in defense of the life of the unborn and the rights of us all.

The people of St. Johns have always been very generous when supporting worthy causes. I can assure you that these young people deserve your support and I urge you to do so. First with your prayers, and second, with any other help you can give them.

Mass Intentions - the stipends for Masses has remained the same for over 30 years throughout the Dioceses of Wisconsin. Recently when the Bishops of the state of Wisconsin gathered, they decreed that the stipends should be adjusted. Mass stipends will now be \$20 (formerly \$10). As always, Mass stipends are paid to the parish and not the priest directly. Thank you!

Please note the following guidelines on scheduling a Mass:

- Only one scheduled intention can be booked per Mass. This one scheduled intention can have no more than three names within the intention.
- A family can book no more than four scheduled Masses per person in a calendar year and only two of those can be weekend Masses.
- ♦ Masses for 2025 are fully booked.
- The calendar for Mass Intentions for 2026 are now open. Please call or drop in during business hours to schedule. Please know that some dates might not be available as we honored first the recently deceased.
