Dear Parishioners: As you read this, I will have just completed my annual priest retreat. Every priest is required to go on retreat once a year per the guidelines of Canon Law. The specifics of the retreat are at the discretion of the priest.

This year I heard of an opportunity to participate in a retreat led by Father Timothy Gallagher, offering a retreat for priests and deacons on how to embrace Ignatius of Loyola's rules for discernment of spirits.

Getting Ready For Lent



The Pillars of Lent From the Gaints Perspective

In the Gospel of St. Matthew, during the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explains three ways that we can turn our hearts to the Lord. These special paths to God are now known as the three pillars of Lent: almsgiving (see Matthew 6:1-4), prayer (see Matthew 6:5-15) and fasting (see Matthew 6:16-18).

When we incorporate all of these pillars into our lives, we'll grow closer to the Lord, especially as we prepare our hearts for the glorious celebration of Easter. Throughout the centuries, the saints have meditated deeply on these subjects. Here are just a few quotes to inspire you this Ash Wednesday and throughout the holy season of Lent.

Almsgiving

"Give him what you can: the merit is not in whether it is big or small, but in the intention with which you give it." St. Josemaria Escriva

Fasting

"Properly speaking, fasting consists in abstaining from food, but speaking metaphorically it denotes abstinence from anything harmful, and such especially is sin." St. Thomas Aquinas

Prayer

"Prayer is not asking. Prayer is putting oneself in the hands of God, at this disposition, and listening to his voice in the depths of our hearts."

St. Teresa of Calcutta

"Lent is a time of truth. Christians, called by the Church to prayer, penance, fasting, and self-sacrifice, place themselves before God and recognize themselves; they rediscover themselves."

DEVOTIONS EXPLAINED!

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

In the earliest years of Christianity, the locations central to the story of Holy Week — the Garden of Gethsemane, Calvary, the Holy Sepulcher, and more — were destinations for pilgrims who wanted to experience Christ's sacrificial love for us in a physical way. In the years after the Crusades, pilgrimage to the Holy Land became impossible for



most Christians, and the Stations of the Cross was popularized as a devotional means to pray through the passion and death of Christ. Throughout history the number of stations has varied, with different traditions focusing on different events. In the 18th century, the number was officially fixed at 14 by Pope Clement XII. These stations are taken from the Gospel accounts of Christ's passion and death, though there are several which are derived from tradition and apocryphal sources, such as the meeting of Mother and Son and St. Veronica wiping the face of Christ.

Please see the attached page and note our times for the Stations of the Cross. Attend at least once or as many times as you can!

The season of Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5th. It is helpful for us to decide on what we will do before Lent actually begins so that we are ready on Ash Wednesday. Would you like to "unplug" from screens by setting an easy goal of time to fast? Here is a simple theme for each week to help stay committed:

- Set aside social media and phones
- Step out of your comfort zone
- · Stand tall against what is difficult
- Spend time with family
- · Savor sacred Scripture renew your mind



St. Joseph's Table is a religious custom and tradition that started centuries ago in Sicily. When Sicilians were affected by a severe drought, they turned to St. Joseph the "Father of Jesus and Head of the Holy Family" to rescue them. As a result of their prayer and intercession of St. Joseph, an abundance of rain was poured over the fields to save their crops. As a sign of gratitude to God, the Sicilians committed themselves to share the fruit of the earth with the poor.



As we come upon this feast day, we remember that one of the disciplines of Lent is to give alms to the poor. We will have a monetary collection from March 15th through March 23rd to help families of our parish as well as those in the community. St. John the Baptist Guide to Lent 2025

The traditional Lenten means of preparing our hearts for Easter are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. For those who will one day find their way to Heaven, these are sure, safe, and effective means of getting there. As a reminder:

Days of Fasting:

Catholics from ages 18-59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means eating one full meal and two smaller meals; no snacks.

Days of Abstinence:

Catholics from age 14 years and older are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. This obligation ends with death.

These practices are designed for spiritual growth. Catholics are not to excuse themselves lightly from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.


