FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: As I mentioned last weekend at Mass, Bishop Battersby has assigned Fr. Todd Mlsna to be our Associate Pastor here at St. John the Baptist. He was here about 20 years ago, so perhaps some of you remember him. Most recently he has been serving in the Stevens Point area. Fr. Todd is eager and happy to be with us!

Fr. Todd's arrival will be of great assistance in helping to cover Masses during my time away this summer in Washington D.C. I don't know the exact dates for my studies, but I will be away for June, July and part of August. Fr. Todd will arrive on May 1st and will be a full-time Associate for our parish.

During the summer we will have a number of projects. Landscaping will be installed around the statues of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Bernadette, between the garage and the church. The final part of the tuckpointing will be completed on the church. We are also planning to place soft lighting upon our high steeple, allowing our church steeple to be visible at night.

Furthermore, playgrounds are needed for both Columbus sites at St. John's Primary school and for Our Lady of Peace Intermediate School. Collectively this will be a fundraising effort for both Columbus Catholic School Playgrounds. Several benefactors have already contributed some early funding; however, to cover the entirety of the project we will still be hoping to raise around \$200,000.

The playground at the St. John the Baptist Primary School has already been designed and will include the soft PIP (Poured in Place) rubber surfacing. A 3-D image of this playground will be put on display in the entry of the church shortly. These playgrounds will be a great blessing for our students and will help to support our continually increasing enrollment. Currently Columbus Schools has about 30 students in the graduating class but about 60-70 per grade in the Primary school. We are continuing to see great enthusiasm for our school!

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and bless us.

At the end of the Holy Mass, Bishop Battersby will impart the *Papal Blessing* with the attached plenary indulgence, obtainable by all the faithful who receive this *Blessing* under the usual conditions.

"Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day (cf. *Enchiridion Indulgentiarum*, IV ed., norm. 18, § 1), the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in Purgatory, if they receive Holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, applicable only to the deceased" (Decree on the Granting of Indulgence during the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025, III).

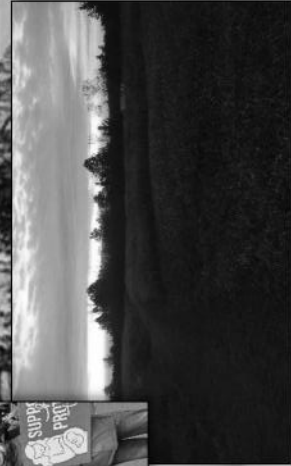


A Season of Hope: Embracing Christ's Light This Winter
