FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: This weekend concludes the octave of Easter. We are people of the Resurrection, let us once again meditate on the great gift of Christ rising from the tomb. ~ Normally, we run away from a fire. We fear its destruction, its danger, its unpredictability. But during the Easter Vigil, we went to the fire. This fire wasn't like the fires we know. This was the Easter fire-blazing in the darkness, defying the night. A fire not of destruction, but symbolizing God's power and presence.

The Easter fire symbolized Christ, the Light of the World. The One who entered our darkness, not to be swallowed by it, but to break it open from the inside. To set the world ablaze with divine light. This fire also symbolized the Holy Spirit. The same Spirit that ignited the bush before Moses—a fire that burned without consuming. A fire that doesn't exhaust life, but completes it. Gives life meaning and purpose. You see, sin is a fire that exhausts us. Sin burns and leaves nothing but ash. But grace? Grace is a fire that never runs out. It glows steady. It gives light. It gives life.

In the very beginning, God created the world. God said, "Let there be light, and there was light. And God saw how good it was." The creation of light was God's first gift of creation. And in the Resurrection, it's the first gift of a new creation. A new creation now redeemed by Christ. Divine Mercy is so appropriate a celebration to conclude the octave of Easter. It is through God's mercy that we are made new, that we participate in God's victory of new Life.

On Good Friday, the casket was closed, the stone rolled in place. Darkness seemed to win. Hope seemed lost. But at Easter, the Light of the World, the One who created light, rose from the grave. Light burst forth from the tomb. It could not be contained. "The darkness is over and the real light begins to shine." (1 John) Let the fire of Christ conquer the cold places in our heart. He is Risen. He is Risen indeed.




