May God bless you, and may God bless the United States of America.



Hello everyone and happy summer! My name is Paige Preston, and as some of you may remember from a few years ago when I spoke at Masses, I have been serving as a missionary with NET Ministries for the past two years. NET Ministries is a Catholic organization that sends out missionary teams across the United States to minister to middle and high school students nationally.

Throughout my time these past two years, I have been blessed with incredible opportunities to witness God work time and time again. I wanted to share some of the impacts that this beautiful ministry is having:

In California my first year, we hosted an overnight retreat for middle school students. On this retreat, one middle school girl and I started talking at meal time and it went well; I ended up sitting next to her and her friends for following meals, getting to chat with her and know a little bit of who she is. Little did I know that she was being greatly impacted by our seemingly light-hearted conversations. As our team was packing up to leave the retreat, she came and found me in the dark and began to share about the way that the retreat had changed her. She looked at me and cried as she opened her heart up to me about some struggles and serious challenges she was dealing with in her life. She told me that I changed her life; she now believed that she could one day be a missionary herself. I am so grateful for that encounter. She doesn't know it, but that interaction came at a time when I needed it a lot too, when I myself was questioning why I left home and left the normal path of life to serve as a missionary. God works in amazing ways.

Another glory story took place in Indiana, where my team and I were leading a retreat for a small Catholic middle school. On this retreat, my small group of girls were all pretty good friends, but I quickly learned that even though they knew each other well, they didn't talk about their faith with one another, despite attending Catholic school. During our time of prayer on that retreat, I was sitting in the back of the church with one of my teammates, offering to pray for students and their specific intentions that they might have. One of my small group girls came over to us and couldn't even verbalize her prayer requests because she was crying, she just wanted prayers. We prayed over her and she went back to her pew. Afterwards, when I was talking with my small group, she shared with the whole group how nice the prayer time was. She wasn't the only one; many of the girls in that group started sharing, asking questions and opening up to answering about their own beliefs. It was beautiful.

Over the course of the past two years, my teams have met thousands of youth across the country, leading hundreds of retreats. I could go on and on and on about all of the ways that God has shown up for these students and how they have left impacted. But not only did God work in the hearts of the youth we were ministering to, but He also worked in us missionaries. Travelling, living, and working with the same group of people for months has its share of trials, but through it, we were able to grow in love. One of the common questions I would hear someone ask the person they were sitting next to in the van was, "how has your prayer been?" I developed some of the most intentional relationships that I have ever experienced in my life, and that is because they are rooted in God.


I want to sincerely thank everyone who has supported me in this mission with NET Ministries, both spiritually and financially. I am extremely grateful that you helped provide me with the opportunity to serve in this way and allow the Lord to use me and shape me in such a unique way.

Looking forward, I am going to be continuing my time with NET as an organization, but this time I will be working as a supervisor. That means that I will be able to pastorally care for the missionaries and provide guidance as they go and care for our youth.
