FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: What are marriage banns? Are they still required? This question was asked of me a while ago, so I will share a bit on this. Historically, marriage banns served for the discovery of impediments to a marriage, such as a previous marriage. Today with both social media and our highly mobile society, the physical posting of marriage banns is no longer as effective in the discovery of marriage impediments.

So what Are Banns? Simply put marriage banns are public announcements of a couple's intention to marry. They traditionally give anyone with a legitimate reason to object to the marriage - such as a prior marriage or another impediment - the opportunity to come forward and share what they know. The word 'bann' itself comes from a Germanic word meaning to proclaim or summon. Hence the word 'banner'.

Marriage Banns were made compulsory by the Lateran Council of 1215. They were also required in the 1917 Code of Canon Law. However, by 1983 they were no longer universally required. The Bishops in both the USA and Canada do not mandate the publication of marriage banns. In Italy, however, the requirement is still an obligation. I remember walking to school and often seeing the marriage banns stapled to the Monumento Nazionale a Vittorio Emanuele II, an impressive building erected in the center of Rome in the early 1900's. Today this building is disparagingly called the 'Wedding Cake.' Not because any weddings happen here, but because the building itself looks like one giant layered wedding cake.

Here at St. John's we still publish the upcoming marriages in our bulletin. This is a commendable practice as it encourages us to pray for the couples who are preparing for marriage. Please pray for our upcoming marriages. We have three scheduled for this Fall. Also please encourage those whom you know who have a civil marriage, to have their marriage blessed in the church, for the strength and grace of Christ's presence in their union.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and bless us.

Alive on Mission Last week we reflected on the qualities that mark a parish fully alive in Christ. This week we step back to consider why those qualities matter so much in today's changing world.

From Christendom to Apostolic Mission

For centuries the Church lived within what is often called a Christendom model. In that world, the wider culture supported Christian values, faith was handed on naturally in families and schools, and parishes focused mainly on providing the sacraments and caring for those who came.

Today, however, the situation has changed. Society no longer reinforces Catholic belief and practice, and faith can no longer be assumed to pass automatically from one generation to the next. This is not a reason for discouragement—it is an invitation from the Lord to renew how we live our mission.

We are now being called to embrace an Apostolic model, one that looks more like the early Church. In an apostolic age, parishes cannot simply wait for people to come; they must be intentional about forming disciples, equipping them to live and share their faith, and reaching out with compassion to those who are searching or who may have drifted away.

Thriving parishes today show clear signs: reverent worship, healthy leadership, deepening faith formation, hospitality, missionary outreach, and generous stewardship. These qualities give us a vision of what it means to be fully alive in Christ's mission.

Given this shift in models, we are called to engage in bold, brave, and Spirit-led pastoral planning—not simply to maintain what has been, but to move forward with hope.

Far from being a burden, this moment can be a time of great joy. Like the apostles in the early Church, we are invited to trust the Holy Spirit and rediscover the joy of the Gospel in our own time.

TWO NEW SAINTS!

Sunday, September 7th was a historic day! Pope Leo canonized two Italian laymen, and one is the first millennial saint!

St. Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901 - 1925), known as the "Man of Beatitudes," embodied the Gospel in his daily life, especially in service to others. As he said himself, "Jesus comes to me every morning in communion, and I return the visit by going to serve the poor." But he did not only spend his time in prayer and service - he loved to be with his family and friends. His favorite past-time was mountain climbing, hiking not only for adventure but also for conversations on the way, which he often turned to faith. He died at the age of 24 of polio, likely contracted during his service of the poor.



St. Carlos Acutis (1991 - 2006) also had a deep love for the Most Holy Eucharist. He called it his "highway to heaven." He reminded others, "The more we receive the Eucharist, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven." This love, combined with his love of technology, inspired him to create a website about Eucharistic miracles around the world. You can find his work at <https://www.miracolieucaistici.org/>. He died from leukemia at the age of 15.
