THE DEACON IS SPEAKIN'

Last week in his From the Pastor's Desk column Father Thelen reminded us that October is the Month of the Rosary. The story behind why we celebrate the Rosary is an interesting one and an important one for Catholics to know and remember.

The year 1571 was a perilous year for the Church and for Western Europe. The empire of the Ottoman Turks had conquered the Greek peninsula and had turned its eyes to the west. They had assembled a massive fleet and were prepared to invade what Winston Churchill would later refer to as the soft underbelly of Europe. To oppose them was a much smaller fleet of ships from Venice, Spain, the Papel States and a few other city states.

Aware of the numerical superiority of the Turkish fleet Pope St. Pius V called for all Catholics to pray the rosary asking our Blessed Mother to intercede for us on behalf of the allied fleet. On October 7, 1571 the two fleets entered into battle off the coast of the city of Lepanto. At the height of the battle a sudden and unexplained shift in the wind turned the tide of battle in favor of the Christian fleet who won a smashing and decisive victory. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of Mary and declared October 7th to be the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, later renamed Our Lady of the Rosary.

Once again we live in perilous times. The forces of darkness threaten us from all sides. There is war and threats of war and violence around the world. Fear and uncertainty grips the hearts of many as our cities, our schools, our shopping centers and yes, even our Churches become targets of violence.

In his column, Father Thelen invites us to pray the rosary during the month of October and beyond. Mary, our Mother, saved us in 1571 and she will do it again in 2025 if we but ask her for help.


