FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. John the Baptist Parish Family:

Last Sunday we celebrated World Mission Sunday. In my homily for last weekend I talked about the challenges of being a missionary. One specific challenge I addressed in my homily was my diagnosis of multiple sclerosis. I addressed this to be transparent with you the people of God. A frequently asked question that I have been getting from people is: "What should we do if you fall or have a problem?" My reply to this question is what would you do for someone else who did the same thing? My suggestion is that if I'm having a problem for 30 seconds or a minute, please don't be afraid to check with me. Spasms and twitches are a regular part of my life these days. There is nothing to worry about. I would ask that you continue to pray for me as I will pray for you as we continue our mission.

During the month of November, we have two celebrations. First, we celebrate All Saints Day. The other celebration, and month long prayer we have is for the faithfully departed. This year our Sunday celebration will be the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed also known as All Souls Day. On All Saints day we pray for the soul's triumphant seeking their intercession as we continue forward on our mission of faith. On All Souls Day we pray for the souls who are suffering because they are not with God yet. During the month of November the church invites us to pray for all of our faithfully departed brothers and sisters, but she especially invites us to pray in a particular way for the souls that are in purgatory. Purgatory is that place of purification were souls gain the perfection they need to enter into eternal life with God in heaven. It is always a good idea to pray every day for those who have died.

On November 7, I will celebrate my 27th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. Anniversary days are a beautiful time to reflect in Thanksgiving for these beautiful years God has given to me to be a priest in his vineyard. I pray that God will continue to give me what I need to be a faithful servant in God's vineyard. Thank you, Lord, for giving me the beautiful gift of the priesthood.

Finally, I would like to give a shout out to the ushers who help us at Mass. Your job is a very important one. I was visiting someone this week who really appreciated the great work of our ushers. She especially appreciated those who ushered at the 9AM Mass as they were very helpful to her and her husband. I want to thank all the ushers who help in so many ways whether it is by taking up the collection, greeting the people as they come to church, and perhaps cleaning up a mess or two; your presence helps the people to know that they are welcome in the house of God. Thank you for all you do as ushers.

May St. John the Baptist and all the holy men and women saints of God intercede for us today and always.
