FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners of St John the Baptist!

It's maybe a bit late to do a recap of 2025, but nevertheless I thought I might give it a try. It was about this time last year that Bishop Battersby asked me to study Canon Law. New opportunities are exciting; however, this new direction involved a lot of challenges and the dedication of once again going back to school. Parish life however continued and I was blessed in 2025 to celebrate 491 Masses, 28 Baptisms, 4 weddings and 24 funerals. The Mass count may seem high but it is manageable. My second year as a priest I exceeded 600 Masses in one year and that was too much.

We were blessed in May to receive Fr. Mlsna. It was such a privilege to share ministry with him. The humility and prayerfulness he exhibited at Mass was equally lived in the rectory. He suffered from so many health challenges, yet he was a man of constant gratitude. Our time overlapped just a few weeks in May, but I knew he would do well in the summer. The month of May was also a time of graduations and I was so honored to be able to celebrate the graduations of so many really integrated and holy young graduates from our schools. Having spent 3 years with them it was an incredible privilege to be part of their graduations and pray for their futures.

Then June and July was new beginnings in DC. The studies were not easy, but I appreciated growing deeper in the knowledge of our faith. This is my third time entering higher education. My Canon Law studies should conclude in the summer of 2028. By its completion I will have completed 14 years of post high-school studies. Despite the intensity of the studies, I did greatly appreciate the opportunities to meet so many other faithful religious and lay persons studying with me. It's always such a support to know how broad and expansive our church is.

Upon my return in August, there was plenty to catch up on. However, I so much appreciated our incredible staff and Fr. Mlsna who kept everything together during my absence. Classes resumed for me in September on Zoom. Thankfully, classes went well and I grew in proficiency in Latin. Come November I was saddened that Fr. Mlsna would not be with us, but also thankful for his opportunity to minister on his own in Mauston.

As I look forward to 2026, I treasure each of you and the deep support I feel in our parish. I am also excited by the emerging hunger for the sacraments. Around 13 adults are seeking to become candidates or catechumens to enter the church. Additionally, nearly 15 couples are currently working with me to have weddings or to make their marriages regular. Please pray for all of these couples and individuals.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the sick will be offered following the 4:30pm Mass on Saturday, January 31st as well as following the 7:00am, 9:00am and 11:00am Mass on Sunday, February 1st.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

- * Anointing is available to those who are seriously sick, preparing for surgery, experiencing decline due to aging, and especially to those who are nearing the end of life.
- * The "Last Rites" often refers to the sacraments of Anointing of the Sick, Reconciliation, and Viaticum (final reception of the Eucharist as "food for the journey" to eternal life) in some combination.
- * To schedule the Anointing of the Sick, please contact the office at 715-384-3252 ext. 0

Please do not wait until the very last minute to receive this great sacrament of healing!

Hospital Care Notice: Most hospitals are no longer asking patients their religious affiliation upon admittance. Spiritual services are still being provided, such as Anointings and Communion visits. However, the patient must notify the nursing staff of their desire to be placed on the Communion list or to have a priest visit. Please keep this in mind if you or a loved one is admitted to a hospital. Spiritual care is of very great importance during hospital stays and when preparing for surgeries.

If you are anticipating a hospital visit or upcoming surgery, please notify the parish if you would like to be anointed, go to Confession and/or receive Communion beforehand. An appointment can be made and one of our priests can make a visit.

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. Chapel at St. Joseph's Hospital, Marshfield, Wis.

At one time, this beautiful chapel was part of St. Joseph's hospital. Located on the second floor the Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother would attend Mass here daily. Each morning and evening they would gather here to sing the Liturgy of the Hours and on the first Sunday of the month they would spend the afternoon in Adoration. Fr. Agnew, a retired priest of the Diocese, took care of the needs of this chapel. (Information received from Sr. Rita. The chapel was removed before Sr. Rita came to Marshfield, but Sr. Barbara remembers it well.)

A parishioner of St. John's states, "I spent many Sunday mornings there at 6am Mass! With no Saturday night Masses, employees needed to avail themselves of that early Mass."

World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life will be celebrated in parishes on the weekend of Jan. 31st-Feb. 1st. Please pray for all those who have answered the call to consecrated life, aspiring towards joyful holiness in the service of the Church and world. Pray also for many more laborers to enter the vineyard so that Jesus Christ may be better known, experienced, and loved.

Growing in Love Through Formation

A great gift in this past semester has been life with my brother seminarians. Community life has been joyful and steady, filled with both structured and simple moments: playing chess, running and hiking, board games, movie nights, testing survival skills, carving pumpkins, running turkey trots, and spending meaningful time with family. These ordinary activities create space for fraternity, prayer, rest, worship, and seeing how the Lord is working. Congruently, my studies—especially in Thomistic philosophy—have helped focus and restructure my perception of the world.

By understanding reality in a more rooted, clear, and truthful way, this allows daily recognition of God's presence and goodness more easily and frequently. This has also led to meaningful conversations about how we can experience greater happiness and freedom through knowing our natural ends. Likewise, this brings about peace in trials, as walking with Jesus and seeing his goodness brings about a trust that He safeguards us in any circumstance that may arise.

Alongside community life, another highlight has been walking with men as an older brother, giving encouragement, support, and practical resources as they seek healing from past and ongoing wounds. This has taken place both in small groups and in one-on-one conversations. Listening to their stories, pointing them toward Christ, and witnessing Scripture being applied to real situations has deeply moved my own heart. These moments continue to affirm St. Paul's words: "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free."





Praying and learning more in depth about different forms of prayer has been a joy this semester. Through the Encounter School of Ministry, I've been learning the foundations of intercessory prayer and prayer in the Holy Spirit, rooted in Scripture and Church tradition. This formation strengthens my confidence and freedom in praying with others, especially on prayer teams. A personal joy has been adoration and simply taking time to spend with Christ in His Blessed Sacrament. One meaningful prayer with a woman from the school referenced Matthew 13:3-9, evoking the image of the sower and a field, which highlighted how our loved ones' journeys unfold in unique circumstances, and how we can trust that the Lord is guiding them and loving them even when they fall on "rocky soil."

As Advent invited deeper reflection and preparation for Christ's coming, I felt called to look more honestly at my own life and ask what might be getting in the way of my relationship with Him. This led to a renewed surrender in areas like my studies, and discipline in fasting. It has also renewed my awareness that each day and its blessings are gifts from God—meant to be received with gratitude and detachment rather than taken for granted or becoming attached to the gifts received in themselves.


