FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners of St. John the Baptist. This weekend we celebrate First Holy Communion with our 2nd graders and their families. In watching our children receive Holy Communion for the first time, we ourselves are renewed in our joy of receiving Our Lord in Holy Communion. Each reception of Holy Communion is a supernatural grace and such a gift!

The bread and wine that is carried forward during the Offering of the Gifts is handed to the priests and servers. This simple matter is then elevated and consecrated, blessed and broken. The words of the Eucharistic prayer are pronounced, the bells are rung, and through God's mighty power the simple bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus. The priest then steps down to distribute Holy Communion and the very spot where the priest had received just simple bread and wine, now becomes the place of offering the very Body and Blood of Jesus. Our Lord comes within us through Holy Communion to nourish us, strengthen us and to give us His Life – so that we can then give that Life of Jesus to others.

Last week in the bulletin column I introduced St. Justin the Martyr who died in 165 AD. I place again another quote from him, which speaks so perfectly about the early church's true belief in the real presence of Jesus in Holy Communion – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. St. Justin says, "We do not consume the eucharistic bread and wine as if it were ordinary food and drink, for we have been taught that as Jesus Christ our Savior became a man of flesh and blood by the power of the Word of God, so also the food that our flesh and blood assimilates for its nourishment becomes the flesh and blood of the incarnate Jesus by the power of his own words contained in the prayer of thanksgiving." (155 AD)

May St. John the Baptist pray for us and bless each of you.

Keep our Youth in prayer as summer arrives! Many will be experiencing Adventure Camp, Steubenville and participating in Mission Trips; some for the first time and others as a repeat experience. Others will be preparing for Confirmation in September.

If you are new to St. John's or have never participated in Youth Group, below is an explanation of this opportunity!

Who goes to Youth Group?

Youth group is open to young people in grades 8 - 12. We meet in the St. Francis Room of St. John the Baptist School. When you come, please enter through the St. Francis room door on the west side of St. John's Primary. St. Francis is above the door you will enter!

Why does Youth Group matter?

Youth group is meant to encourage and equip students in grade 8-12 to become joyful disciples of Jesus Christ. We do this by attending events, fellowship, prayer, music, service projects and more.

What happens at Youth Group?

- * We start with prayer.
- * We sing a praise song or two like "Good Good Father"
- * Everyone has a chance to share about their week, a high (positive thing) and low (negative thing).
- * We also ask if anyone has a "glory story" to share - something they did this week for God that they don't usually do.
- * We usually play a quick game.
- * I share about the theme for 15 to 20 minutes
- * We break into small groups or gather as one big group, discuss the theme and our thoughts about it.
- * We end with a snack and dismiss.

We will meet typically on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays with some exceptions.

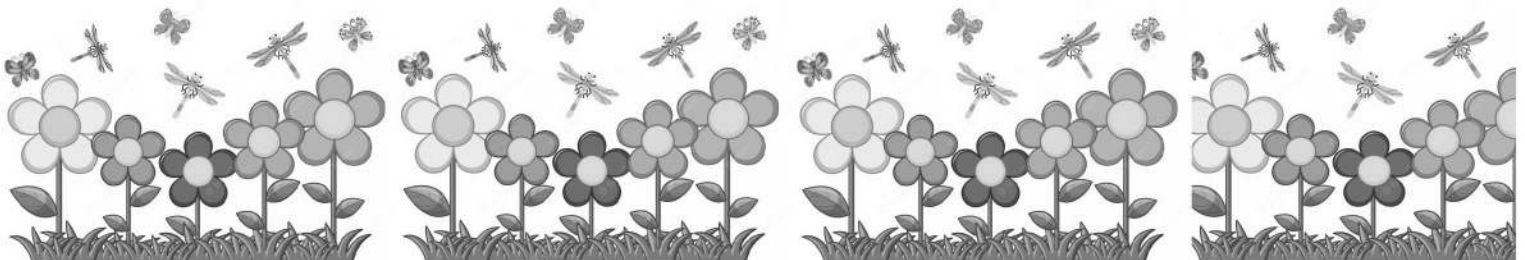
