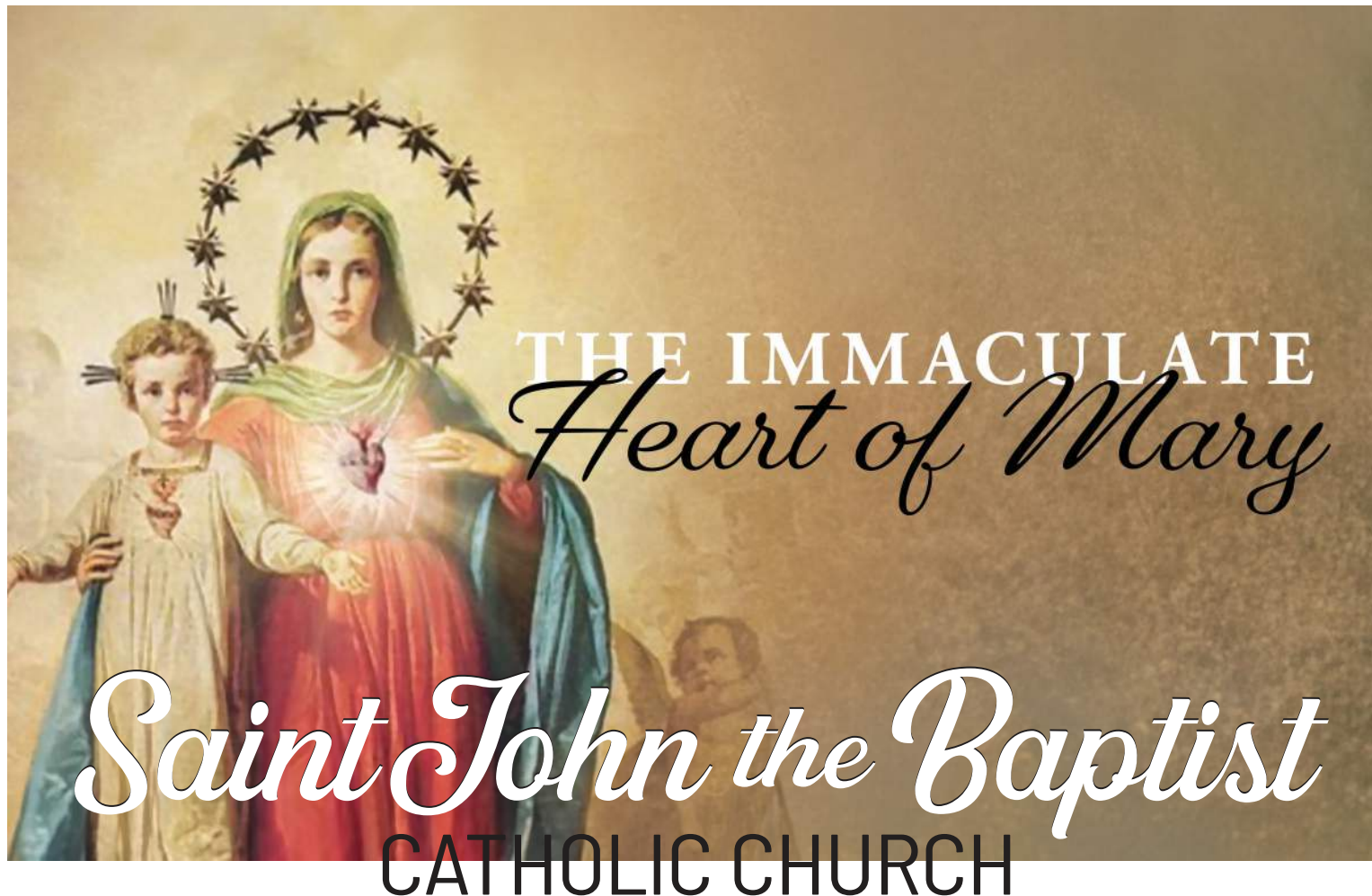

THE DEACON IS SPEAKIN'

The dog days of summer are upon us! Along with the summer heat August brings us a wide variety of liturgical treasures as we celebrate some of the giants of our faith.

August 6th is the Transfiguration of our Lord. Peter, James and John are blessed to see the full glory of Jesus on the mountaintop. This vision will strengthen them during the difficult times to come. F.Y.I. this view from Mt. Tabor is spectacular!

On the 15th we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although this year it is not a Holy Day of Obligation, it is one of our most important Solemnities as we remember that Mary was assumed bodily into heaven. One week later on the 22nd is the memorial of the Queenship of Mary. Mary is not only our mother, she is also our queen and the Queen of Heaven as well.

On the 29th we remember the martyrdom of St. John the Baptist, one of our patron saint's feast days, the other being his birth which we celebrated in June.

Deacons have two patron saints and on August 10th we celebrate one of them. St. Lawrence was arrested along with Pope Sixtus II and four other deacons who were subsequently martyred. Lawrence, however, was released and told to bring to the magistrate the treasures of the Church. When he brought the poor of Rome and proclaimed them to be the "treasures of the Church" he was placed on a grill and roasted alive. It is said his final words were, "You may turn me over, I'm done on this side."

August also presents us with what is arguably the most famous mother / son saint duo, St. Monica (the 27th) and St. Augustine (the 28th). It is generally accepted that Augustine would not be a saint if his mother had not spent years praying for him. The moral...never stop praying for someone. Do not give up hope!

August shows the diversity of our church with many other saints both men and women. Among these are St. John Vianney (the 4th), St. Dominic (the 8th), St. Clare (the 11th) and St. Maximilian Kolbe (the 14th). So many Saints, so little time.

On a more somber, secular note, we have August 6th and 9th marking the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Pray for peace and pray that such weapons of mass destruction will never again be used.

Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth, pray for us.

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office for Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. 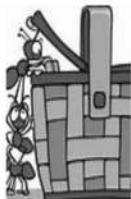

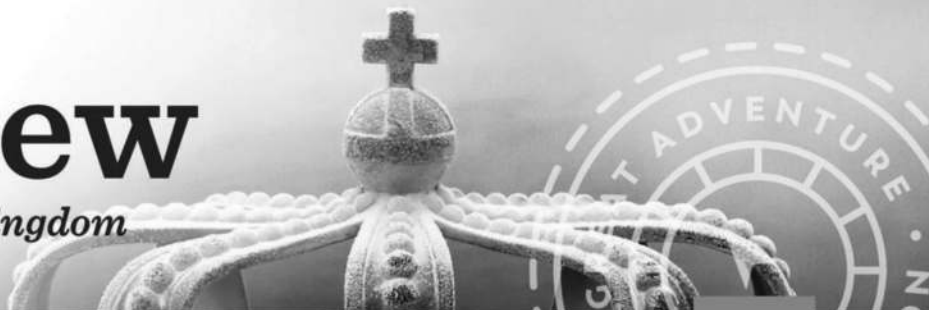
